Granite Countertops Cost Specifications

As previously mentioned, calculating granite countertop pricing changes depending on the type of project being performed and what you are looking for.

Quantity: The more granite you need to make for your countertops, the higher the cost will be to have it fabricated and installed.

Finish: A finish is what gives the stone that bright shine. Distinct types of finishes can be different priced, adding to your total.

Design: Granite has a large assortment of designs, colors and options. Granite colors that are in higher demand will often be at a higher price.

Rarity: Depending on where the stone was quarried, it could affect what it will cost you. Granite quarried from one location will be more expensive than stones quarried from multiple locations due to its ease of availability.

Giallo Ornamental

Giallo Ornamental granite is a lovely, speckled granite quarried from Brazil. The natural brown and grey colors complement each other to make it pop in any room. It fits very well for interior designs that want to have a nature feel or an accent piece to add some color to a room.

Black Galaxy

River White

Supplemental Costs for Granite Countertops

Once you have chosen the type of granite you are looking for, you will need to be aware of supplemental costs outside of the actual fabrication and installation.

- **Cutouts**: Typically, kitchens need a sink cutout with a faucet hole. Some kitchens have multiple sinks which require more cutouts, which will be extra charges.
- Location: Depending on where you are located, the price of labor will increase. Transporting granite slabs and tiles to a location farther away from the fabricator will cost you more compared to someone

living closer.

- **Region**: Based on your state and area, prices will change. Similar to how gas prices vary in different states and areas, granite countertops follows a similar pattern.
- Edging: Stone countertops have a variety of different edging options. Popular edges like Straight and Rounded are cost effective, look good and easily fit within a budget. Premium edges like Ogee or Cove Ogee require more precision, adding up to a higher cost total. Seeing the different edges in our Edge Visualizer Tool can help you better understand the complexity of their designs.
- **Complexity**: Bigger and more difficult jobs will require more time to install and shape the material to your liking. Simpler jobs like countertop changes may not cost as much as a full kitchen redesign.
- **Backsplash**: New countertops often require a new backsplash as well. Getting the backsplash done would be a separate charge as it required the countertops to finish installation first before adding a new backsplash.
- Old Countertop Removal & Disposal: Most companies will charge you to remove the old countertops and dispose of the excess material. This price varies as well since it is dependent on the square footage amount being removed.
