

How To Keep Quartz Countertops Shiny

However, there will come a time when a homeowner starts noticing their quartz countertops may look less bright than usual. That glorious sheen from a healthy countertop is becoming dull and faded from constant use. While it may seem impossible to prevent this from happening, there are many things a homeowner can do to make sure your quartz countertops remain shiny and healthy.

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Why Do Stone Countertops Fade

Stone countertops can fade from general wear and use over time. It is unfortunate that shiny objects never stay shiny forever. While stone does not naturally shine, there is a finishing layer placed on stone countertops to give it that new countertop sheen homeowners are used to seeing. Some of the main reasons of your countertop losing its shine are:

- Constantly cleaning
- Improper cleaning products
- Small scraping and scratches

Keeping Quartz Shining

Never fear, for there are many ways to keep your quartz countertops glistening bright for years to come by implementing these 10 strategies.

1. Clean Regularly

While constantly cleaning your countertops may fade the sheen over time; the shine will fade much quicker if you do not clean it on a regular basis. Things such as dust, dirt, crumbs, and spills will dull the countertop much faster if they are left to sit for extended periods of time. Take time to clean the countertop with a mild dish soap, warm water, and a soft cloth a couple of times a week to ensure the shine gleams bright.

2. Deep Cleanings

Cleaning on a regular basis in the week is important, but performing a [deep cleaning](#) once a week is a good ritual to keep the countertop and kitchen clean and free from pests. Take the time at the beginning or end of the week to remove everything from the countertop and wipe down every nook and cranny in the kitchen. Being meticulous and thorough as possible will only benefit you, your home, and your quartz countertop; ensuring everything is clean and healthy.

3. Avoid Harsh Chemical Cleaners

A big mistake many homeowners make when cleaning is immediately going for bleach when they encounter a stain. In most situations, bleach is amazing to remove any stain, dirt, or grime in the house; but countertops are not where you want to use it.

Quartz and other stone countertops could become stained and permanently lose their shine if bleached is used on them. The same is also true if grime removers, grout cleaners, ammonia, citric acid sprays, glass cleaners, or other high pH cleaners are used.

4. Use Protective Layers

Protecting your quartz countertops from spills and damage is an excellent way of keeping them shining bright. Using items like:

Coasters	Prevents spills and stains from forming from cups
Trivets	An object placed between a serving dish or bowl between a table or countertop to prevent heat damage
Hot Pads	A pad used to hold hot objects like pots and pans to protect countertop from heat damage or thermal shock
Placemats	An object used to protect a table or countertop from spills from cups or plates

Towels	Useful for catching spills or paint while in the bathroom
Containers	Keeps objects directly off the countertop to prevent stains (i.e.: wet toothbrush, toothpaste, wet brush, etc.)

5. Remove Stains

[Removing stains](#) as quickly as possible will save you a lot of money and time in the future. The longer a stain rests on the countertop, the harder it will be to clean.

Thankfully, quartz countertops are exceptionally easy to clean as they are non-porous and manufactured to be simpler to maintain. Stains do not sink into the stone because there are no pores for the stained material to fill. The best way of removing stains on quartz countertops is with regular cleanings, using some diluted rubbing alcohol and a soft rag, or making a poultice of baking soda.

6. Avoid Hard Scrubbers

Abrasive scrubbers are useful in removing hard to scrape gunk off of plates, but they are not ideal for quartz or stone countertops. The abrasive scrubs will not damage the quartz, but the hard bristles will dull the shine very quickly.

Instead of using hard bristle brushes or abrasive scrubs, use soft cloths or a microfiber cloth which can gently clean the countertop without damaging its luster.

7. Use Quartz Specific Cleaners

8. Professional Polishing

10. Keep Out of Direct Sunlight

Direct sunlight is great every once in a while, but quartz countertops can fade and look dull when exposed to sunlight for too long. The UV rays and exposed heat can weaken the resin binding the quartz minerals together. This not only weakens the stone, but also overexposes the colors with too much light, making them fade over time. To prevent this, keep the blinds closed when you are not home or install the countertop where there is little direct sunlight beaming on them.
