Granite Countertops

Advantages:

- Natural stone look
- Many types to choose from
- Durable
- Heat resistant
- High resale value

Disadvantages:

- Rare granite will cost more
- Heavy objects can cause damages if dropped on the surface
- Needs to be re-sealed once every year

Marble Countertops

Advantages:

- Elegant and timeless look
- Smooth feel
- Easy to fix small damages
- High resale value

Can be used in many places throughout the house, such as bathrooms and kitchens
Many different types to choose from

Disadvantages:

- Higher cost than granite
- Porous
- Prone to scratching
- Needs to be re-sealed about every three months

Quartz Countertops

Advantages:

- Man-made, making customization relatively easy
- Can be engineered to look like natural stone
- Durable
- Does not require sealing
- Environmentally friendly

Disadvantages:

- High cost
- Not heat resistant
- Seams are easily visible

• Does not hold the 'classic' appeal of granite or marble
