It is recommended that you re-seal a Vetrazzo countertop once every year. This is not uncommon, as many other countertops, especially those made of natural stone, require re-sealing. In some cases, natural stone countertops require re-sealing once every few months.

Cleaning

To clean the surface, all you need to do is wipe it down with a damp cloth.

How Much Heat Can a Vetrazzo Countertop Take?

Although the countertops can withstand some degree of heat, it is not recommended that you expose the surface to high heat on a frequent basis. If you do so, you will need to re-seal more often.

Can You Cut on the Surface?

You can cut directly on the surface with a knife but know that it will dull the blade over time.
