Spilling liquids such as those on marble can permanently damage the stone. To clean marble, you must use cleaner that is specifically designed for use with marble. Never use any abrasive cleaners, such as Windex or bleach. You will need to re-seal your marble countertop every few months to protect against damage.

Marble countertops can range from relatively affordable to expensive based on what type you choose. The countertops typically cost between \$40 to \$100 per square foot.
