

Weight of Granite: How Much Do Slabs Weigh?

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Granite is one of the best natural stone options you have for kitchen countertops, bathroom countertops, backsplashes and other home surfaces. The stone is well known and beloved for being attractive, durable and easy to take care of. Granite countertops have seen a significant climb in popularity since the early 1990s, when the stone became more affordable due to an uptick in supply worldwide. Thickness of Granite

The weight of a granite slab will depend on the thickness. Most granite slabs are either $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch thick or $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches thick. Slabs can be thicker, but slabs that are thicker than standard are very rare and are more expensive.

How Much Does Granite Weigh?

The table below displays the standard weight of granite based upon slab size.

$\frac{3}{4}$ inch thick slabs	Less than 13 pounds per square foot
$1\frac{1}{4}$ inch thick slabs	Around 19 pounds per square foot
