Attractive

Natural stone is not cheap. However, granite is one of the least expensive natural stone countertop options. Expect to pay between \$35 to \$75 per square foot depending on the type of granite you choose.

Requires Sealing

As is the case with most natural stones, granite does require sealing. This should not be so much of an inconvenience, as the re-sealing process is easy and will only have to be done around once a year.

What is Quartz?

Quartz is an engineered stone that is created by combining roughly 90 percent quartz with about 10 percent polymer resin. These numbers can be slightly higher or lower depending on the specific brand of quartz but will always be around the same region. Much like granite, the appeal of quartz lies mostly in its appearance and durability. <u>Quartz countertops</u> will be a fantastic addition to any home office or business office.

Cost

Quartz countertops are not cheap. You should expect to pay around \$50 to \$120 per square foot. However, based on the benefits you will receive from the surfaces, the cost can be well worth it.

Not Heat Resistant

One of the major downfalls of quartz countertops is that they are not heat resistant. While this is particularly significant when the material is used for kitchen countertops, it can come into play in the office as well. Just to be careful, use coasters for hot drinks and make sure to avoid spills.
