Fortunately, you often will not have to replace your countertops. Dull granite countertops can be fixed in many ways. The following will highlight four ways you can restore your granite countertop to its original beautiful appearance:

- Removing stains
- Polishing
- Fixing chips
- Sealing

How Do You Remove Stains from a Granite Countertop?

Despite granite countertops being stain resistant, no stone countertops are totally stain-proof. In order to reduce the likelihood of stains, you will need to keep up on cleaning and sealing. If you do happen to encounter stains on your granite countertop, you can fix the issue relatively easily.

Most stains can be removed using a DIY stain remover called a poultice. This is a paste that you mix together and apply to the stain. Different types of stains (such as oil stains, hard water stains, etc.) will require different ingredients for the poultice or methods for removal.

Once you mix the poultice together, apply it to the granite surface at the site of the stain. Then, cover it with plastic wrap and let it sit for 24 to 48 hours. After this, you can remove the plastic wrap and the stain should be gone. If it is not, you can try repeating the process.

How Do You Polish Granite Countertops?

Granite polishing involves applying a polisher to the stone surface and buffing in a circular motion. Make sure when you are doing this to always use a soft cloth – never any harsh cleaning tools such as steel wool.

By following the instructions that come with the polish, you can restore your countertop's luster in no time. Your granite countertop will regain the distinctive shine from when you first had it installed.

How Do You Fix Chips in a Granite Countertop?

Granite countertops can occasionally be impacted by chipping. This should not cause concern, however, as small chips are very easy to fix. There are many chip repair kits you can find, such as [this one](#).

Sealing Granite Countertops: Why and How

Sealing is one of the most important steps for taking care of your granite countertops. Granite, and most natural stone in general, is porous. This means that stains and liquid can work their way down into the pores of the stone and cause damage. To protect against this, you must seal natural stone countertops. Since granite is one of the least porous natural stones, re-sealing is only necessary roughly once per year. This will depend on what type of granite you have, as some require more frequent sealing than others.

As for the process itself, re-sealing your granite countertop is not difficult or time consuming. To start, you will need to clear off and clean the countertop. Once this is done, you can apply the sealer to the surface. After you have applied your sealant, wait 15 minutes for it to set in. If you see that all the sealer has absorbed within this amount of time, apply another coat. When you have waited the proper amount of time, wipe off the excess sealer. Lastly, wait at least 24 hours before using your countertop.

How to Seal a Granite Countertop

Step 1	Clear off and clean the countertop
Step 2	Apply the sealer
Step 3	Wait 15 minutes
Step 4	Wipe off excess sealer
Step 5	Let the countertop sit for 24 hours before use
